### The Change Continues

The Board of Directors of the ministry formerly known as "Samaritan Christian Ministry" (SCM) would like the community to be aware that the ministry has officially reverted to its former name "Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes" (SKW).

This change comes at a time when many changes have taken place in the ministry but everyone hopes it will help to eliminate confusion with Samaritan's Purse as well as easily recognize the focused work of the Samaritan Kitchen ministry. "We feed people in need," notes Flo Rennaker, Board Chair and Acting Executive Director of Samaritan Kitchen, "and that is what we should be best known for doing," she adds.

"We receive calls daily for Samaritan's Purse," says Julie Smith, Operations Manager for Samaritan Kitchen. "It is perfectly understandable that people would think Samaritan Ministry and Samaritan's Purse are one in the same ministry. Maybe the community will be able to better distinguish Samaritan Kitchen from Samaritan's Purse; we certainly hope so. We hate for people to feel like they are getting the run around when they are in need."

Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes currently serves over 500 children in all public school grade levels through their Backpack Program. In addition to the very active Backpack Program, Samaritan Kitchen also provides a Client Choice Pantry for eligible families.

### STATISTICS FOR 2010

During the calendar year of 2010 our various programs helped to feed the hungry of Wilkes. These include:

The **BackPack Program** program was open **35** weeks; distributed **13,368** bags of food which equated to a total of **66,175** pounds for the calendar year with an average of **382** children being served. (*Currently for the 2010-2011 school year we are serving over 500 children every week.*)

The **Client Choice Pantry** program was open a total of **198** days (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday); number of families served equals **4,602**; total number in the household equated to **11,620**; average pounds per day distributed was **1,269**; total pounds for year equals **251,248**; new families added was **393**; and the average households served each day opened was **23**.

The **Saturday Delivery Program** ran **37** weekends. The total number of meals served was **45,588**; total number of repeat families totaled **14,177**; the average repeat families per week equaled **383**; and the average number of meals served per week equated to **1,232**. The Saturday Delivery Program closed at the end of November 2010 due to lack of funding and volunteers to carry out this program.

Founded in 1991 by Alan Shawn Feinstein, the Feinstein Foundation is dedicated to the alleviation of hunger, the importance of community service in education and the values of caring, compassion and brotherhood. ## BACK PACK PROGRAM NEWS!

Our backpack program started off this school year in full swing! On 9/2/10, 177 backpacks were distributed to those who had returned their applications. The program has continued to grow every week this school year with current enrollment numbers exceeding 500 per week. For those not aware, this program provides six nutritious meals, plus snacks, to at-risk school children to take home each Friday. These meals are easy to prepare so that the children can be sure to have food over the weekend. Some examples of items in the backpack include canned spaghetti/ravioli, tuna fish, beans & franks, oatmeal packets, individual cereal boxes, cup-a-soup, individual servings of canned or fresh fruit, breakfast/snack bars and drink boxes. Once a month they also receive a jar of peanut butter as well as saltine crackers. The current cost to provide this program is approximately \$8.00 per week, per child. If you would care to sponsor one or more children per week, just note in the memo section of your check that it is for the Back-Pack program. Thank you!
