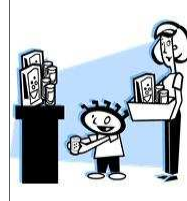
## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING AT SKW!

The Postal Food Drive netted 2560 lbs of food for SKW. This was a great help to SKW. Special thanks to Jeff and his staff at the North Wilkesboro Post Office for the hard work and dedication in Stamping out Hunger. Thanks to all who left bags at their mailboxes all over Wilkes County. A great team of volunteers then collected the food from the various post offices in Wilkes, brought it to the North Wilkesboro Post Office and then sorted the food for distribution to food pantries within Wilkes County.



On Saturday, May 28, the Home Builders Association of Wilkes and Yadkin Counties held a very successful community yard sale that benefited the Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes. More info is inside this newsletter.

The Summer Survival Backpack program was a great success. The students were delighted with the variety of items that were in their last Backpack of the school year. The 510 bags each weighed 15 pounds this year. That is an increase of 3 lbs more that last year. Many thanks to all the folks who help make this possible. ## **FOOD DRIVES NEEDED!**

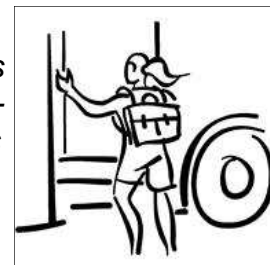
Can you or your group help us? We need non-perishable food - lists of suggestions are on the last page.

## BackPack 2011 - 2012 Kick-off!

The school year has started off with a bang! The BackPack Program was in full swing the first full week of school, sending home 314 BackPacks on Friday, August 26, with school children who had already enrolled in the program for this year. As of Friday, September 9, we are up to 510 BackPacks. For those not aware, this program provides six nutritious meals, plus snacks and drinks, to at-risk school children to take home each Friday. These meals are easy to prepare so that the children can be sure to have food over the weekend. Some examples of items in the backpack include canned spaghetti/ravioli, tuna fish, beans & franks, oatmeal packets, individual cereal boxes, cup-a-soup, individual servings of canned or fresh fruit, breakfast/snack bars and drink boxes. Once a month they also receive a jar of peanut butter as well as saltine crackers.

Last school year, Guidance Counselors were asked about the reaction to the BackPack program. Here is some of the feedback from the counselors: *Students are very appreciative; eager to pick up their bag each week; lots of smiles; healthier food products this year; children would have a lot less to eat if this service was not provided; they are always glad to receive the BackPack; they always ask about it and say thank you; our children love getting their bags; it provides students with a sense of security knowing that they have food over the weekend; without your program several students would go hungry over the weekend; and students would have a harder time concentrating in school on Mondays due to hunger.*



Our goal for this school year is to expand the program to serve **600** school children. The current cost to provide this program is \$7.80 per week, per child. In order for this program to be successful, we need your help! The projected food costs for this program each week are \$4680. Can you help? No amount is ever too small or too large!

If you would care to sponsor one or more children per week, just note in the memo section of your check that it is for the BackPack program. Thank you!

## STATISTICS FOR FY 2010

During the fiscal year of 2010 (July 2010 - June 2011) our various programs helped to feed the hungry of Wilkes. These included:

**The BackPack program** ended the year with 510 students enrolled. Due to enrollment changes, absences, etc., it was an average of 456 students each week. That equals to 14,143 bags and 82,178 pounds of food.



We were open 199 days in the **Client Choice Pantry** and assisted 5190 families for the year, 372 of those were new families that had never received help before. Product given to clients in the pantry equaled 266,595 lbs for the year.

**Project: JOY** went to over 800 needy families this past December. This is our "Christmas Meal in a Box." This is a meal clients can prepare for their families during the holiday season, in addition to the food received through the pantry. It includes meat, whether it be ham, turkey, chicken, etc., assorted vegetables, fruits, baking products and seasonal goodies. This box is given to each family who uses the Client Choice Pantry, as well as each family that has a child on the BackPack Program.

Over 8100 **Volunteer Hours** were contributed last year! Thank you, we couldn't do it without each and every one of you!

The **Home Builders Association of Wilkes and Yadkin County** has completed its community yard sale project that generated good money for the important work being done by Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes. Converting “one man’s junk into another man’s treasure” raised just over \$2,100 in cash, gift cards, and material support of the Back Pack, Summer Survival, and other food distribution efforts. And while that total was impressive to the HBA, Samaritan’s Operations Manager, Julie Smith commented that the amount was roughly that spent in a typical week to feed those the agency helps. So the need remains strong, and Home Builders urges all who can to continue to support Samaritan Kitchen’s efforts...with direct food and/or financial help.

The success of the HBA project is attributed to many. The yard sale was held Saturday, May 28<sup>th</sup> at Sedgewick Homes, at Hamptonville, which provided a great space, advertising, a tent, chairs, and tables, and many hands on details from management and staff. Additional time and hard labor came from Huffman Bros. Samaritan Kitchen’s own people, in part, worked before, during, and after the sale...including SKW volunteer coordinator Elizabeth Ferguson, volunteers Libby Cook Carlton and Arthur Ferguson, truck driver Richard Smith, and several others.

While sales were brisk, thanks to generous donations, there were lots of items left unsold. The HBA made additional donations to the Goodwill Retail Store, Ebenezer’s Sales Store, and Habitat for Humanity’s ReStore. (More thanks to Isaac Kerns)

## Exemplary Agency Volunteer Award

The Second Harvest Food Bank 2011 Exemplary Partner Agency Volunteer Award goes to a volunteer that has gone above and beyond the call of duty in her service to her community.

For 70 years, this volunteer spent her time laboring away on farms in this area. That's right. She worked until she was 70 years old. Now, at 81 and a cancer survivor, she spends a good portion of her week volunteering with Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes in Wilkesboro, NC, where she's been a constant source of help and support since the Kitchen's beginning in 1998.

According to the staff at Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes, she is an invaluable team member. She trains most of the new volunteers in the Client Choice pantry and assists clients with shopping four days a week.

In her work with the food pantry, she has come across many people in need and has gotten to know quite a few of the working poor who come in for help. Recently she said, "I know a lady who came in to the food pantry and said, 'I never thought I'd ever have to do this.' I just told her, 'You have to do what you must. Thank the good Lord you still have your health.'"

She is a deeply compassionate and caring woman that exhibits what it means to love thy neighbor and has been "looking after the least of us" for many years.

For these reasons, it is our honor to present the Second Harvest Food Bank 2011 Exemplary Partner Agency Volunteer Award to Ms. Elva Hayes, volunteer at Samaritan Kitchen of Wilkes in Wilkesboro, NC.

## A "SOUPER SHOUT OUT" GOES TO:

Fourteen teams participated in the **2nd Annual Wilkes Amazing Race (WAR)** organized and hosted by **GoWilkes.com** on Saturday, May 14th. The race began at 11am with a scavenger hunt in Downtown North Wilkesboro, where teams had to follow a series of clues to find their map with the locations of the pit stop challenges. Participating businesses in the scavenger hunt were the Wilkes Art Gallery, Wilkes County Public Library, Hallmark/Quickframe, and D'Moser Travel Agency.

After the scavenger hunt, each team of two left to compete in 9 more "pit stop challenges" across the county. As a part of their strategy, the teams could choose their own route. Teams were given a 1 hour penalty for any pit stop challenge that was not completed. Pit stop locations and their challenges were:

**Black Cat Station, North Wilkesboro:** The teams had to look throughout the train set-ups, and find specific scenes.

**Boy Scouts Takachsin Chapter, Order of The Arrow, W. Kerr Scott,**

**Wilkesboro:** Teams had to build a fire using wood found along a trail and only 3 matches, then make the fire high enough to burn a rope.

**Carolina West Wireless, Wilkesboro:** Teams had to pick one of several different models of cell phones, then text 5 messages to a specific number. Messages had to be perfect, including capitalization and punctuation; otherwise, they had to start the challenge over.

**Leatherwood Mountains, Ferguson:** Teams had to find a historic cemetery on foot, then locate a specific gravestone and report back to the visitor's center with the birth date of the person buried there.

**Super Fly Outdoor Sports, Wilkesboro:** Teams were taken to the W. Kerr Scott Dam Spillway where they took a kayak trip down Yadkin River back to the Super Fly Outdoor Sports location.

**Tipton's Bar-B-Que, Wilkesboro:** Teams had to eat two Ghost Pepper hot wings. In 2007, ghost pepper's were entered into the Guinness Book of World Records as the hottest peppers in the world, more than 400 times hotter than Tabasco sauce!

**Valle Ink Tattoo, Wilkesboro:** Teams were given three clues, then on the wall of dozens of potential tattoos, they had to find the tattoo that fit the clue. Then, after they were done, they were given a temporary tattoo.

**Whippoorwill Academy, Ferguson:** At their annual "Daniel Boone Days" event, teams had to locate a cut-out of Daniel and Rebecca Boone, then convince another festival-goer to take their picture with the cut-out, with one team member wearing a coonskin hat for Daniel and the other team member wearing a bonnet for Rebecca.

**Yadkin River Greenway, Rivers Edge Park, Wilkesboro:** Using 200 1x4" blocks, teams built a tower that measured a minimum of 5' in height. The tower had to be able to stand on its own for at least 3 seconds.

The finish line for the event was located at the Wilkesboro Open Air Market, where an awards ceremony was held for the winners. The celebration also included live entertainment by Crusher Run, and food from Tipton's Bar-B-Que.

The first place team and winner of the \$200 prize, completing all challenges in 2 hr 58 minutes, was Jason and Amanda Wolfe of "Team Wolfepack."

Team Wolfepack was the 2nd place

winner in the 2010 Wilkes Amazing Race.

The second place team and winner of the \$100 prize, at 3 hr 9 min, was William Clark and Anthea Yates of "Team Thickburger." The third place team and winner of the \$50 prize, at 3 hr 26 min, was Stephen and Alicia Price of "The Bullets." The Best Costume trophy was given to Ashley Miller and Kayla Lankford of "Lady Zebras." And finally, a bronze "toilet" trophy was given for last place, to "Team Neck Neck."
